Eugenie C. Scott, executive director of the National Center for Science Education, is recognized internationally as an expert on the controversy surrounding evolution. She will address the political and social issues challenging the science classroom.

Robert T. Pennock, professor of history, philosophy, and sociology of science at Michigan State University, is the author of the Pulitzer Prize-nominated book *Tower of Babel: The Evidence against the New Creationism*. He will define what science is and is not.
