Preregistration, Permission, and Other Enrollment Notes

- ¹ Psychology and Cognitive Science majors and minors can preregister for most courses through CAESAR the week prior to registration. Times are announced by the Registrar's Office. You can preregister for a maximum of 2 courses.
- ² Get a permission number for 205 from Ms. Brenda Robertson in the psychology department office. Numbers will be given out at set times the week prior to registration. See [Swift Thinking](#) for details.
- ³ Applications for permission to enroll in 357 will be available from Brenda Robertson in the psychology department office at set times the week prior to registration. See [Swift Thinking](#) for details. Accepted students will be given permission numbers and will then be able to enroll through CAESAR.
- ⁴ For 397 and 399, get an application from Brenda Robertson in the psychology department office. Fill it out and have it signed by the professor with whom you will be working. Then return it to Brenda and get a permission number. For 398, get a permission number from Brenda; you must be on the list given to her by the honors coordinator, Prof. Uttal.
- ⁵ Psych 337-Human Sexuality features optional visits by guest speakers, as well as movies on relevant topics. These will take place after class, 3:20-5:00 on Mondays and Wednesdays.
